

SURGERY NEWS

There is much good news to share from Prospect House.

We are now fully staffed with three GP's, three reception staff together with a health care assistant and we very much welcome those new to the team. We are currently advertising for a new practice nurse.

Patients can book to see a physiotherapist who is now working from the surgery for the following:

- All soft tissue injuries, sprains, strains or sports injuries.
- Arthritis any joint.
- Possible problems with muscles, ligaments, tendons or bone, eg tennis elbow, carpal tunnel syndrome, ankle sprains.
- Spinal pain including lower back pain, mid-back pain and neck pain.
- Spinal-related pain in arms or legs, including nerve symptoms, eg pins and needles or numbness.
- Changes to walking.
- Post-orthopaedic surgery.

Just call reception to make an appointment.

For pregnancy matters, Claire our community midwife has a fortnightly clinic on a Wednesday.

Further support comes from being part of the Mid Chilterns PCN (Primary Care Network). This includes a Clinical Pharmacist who provides both help with reviewing patients' medication and covers the clinic for Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD).

Help with blood tests, blood pressure monitoring and Body Mass Index (BMI) checks is provided by Kim on a Friday morning.

AUDIOLOGY APPOINTMENTS

An initial Referral for a hearing test is required by the doctor. After that, patients can make an appointment for subsequent hearing tests at either Amersham or High Wycombe Hospitals by telephoning: 01494 323 260 or e-mailing: bht.audiologywh@nhs.net

This system also applies to the NHS audiology service provided by Specsavers in High Wycombe. It is no longer provided by the Specsavers branch in Chesham.





Blood Pressure - Know Your Numbers!

Residents in Buckinghamshire can regularly check their blood pressure at a number of places, such as: community and faith settings; GP surgeries (in Reception at Prospect House) and some pharmacies; as well as at the main libraries in Chesham, Aylesbury and High Wycombe; from where you can also borrow a portable blood pressure monitor using your library card.

Great Missenden Library - You can order in a blood pressure monitor at Great Missenden library using your library card and collect it in the same way as you would order-in a book.

Kinton Pharmacy will take your blood pressure on the premises, but they recommend that you arrange a time with them beforehand. The service is available to anyone over 45 years of age who is not already on blood pressure lowering medication.


Please allow two working days for prescription requests to be processed. It is recommended that you request prescriptions via your NHS Patient Access app to avoid any delays. Alternatively, you can still drop your prescription request in at the surgery or your pharmacy.

Please note: we are unable to accept medication requests by e-mail, nor over the 'phone. This is to maximise efficiency within the practice; it provides speedier access to medication for patients and frees-up the 'phone for those trying to book appointments.

Managing Patient Expectations at Prospect House

Unfortunately, we can only provide a limited number of appointments every day. So we have to manage the appointment books to ensure the best availability according to need. Every day we release urgent appointment slots at 08:30 and 14:00 hrs and these are usually seen on the same day. We also have pre-bookable telephone appointments if you are suffering less urgent symptoms.

All contacts start as a telephone call with our experienced GPs and where possible we try to deal with your case quickly and efficiently over the phone. If the GP determines that they need to see you face-to-face, there is availability each day and you will be given a time to attend your appointment.

Our reception and administration staff are trained to deal with your enquiries as politely and efficiently as possible. We are unfortunately experiencing some abusive behaviour from a small number of patients on the telephone and when calling-in to the Surgery. We hold a duty of care to our staff as well as our registered patients, so a zero-tolerance policy is now being taken.

The Lindengate Charity

Better health and wellbeing through nature On a recent visit to the Lindengate Charity based in Wendover, I was blown away by the magic of the place.

Set in 9 acres of land adjacent to Dobbie's Garden Centre, it is used by Social Prescribers as a place where people suffering with anxiety and other mental health problems can find support through attending wellbeing and nature workshops; by volunteering to help in the gardens; or just as a temporary escape into the midst of an oasis of tranquillity.

A Memory Pathway programme is available for those living with memory loss and dementia.

Conservation is at the heart of the gardens. There were numerous butterflies, bees and all manner of insects enjoying the brambles, nettles, wild flowers and cultivated flowers together with a small orchard of heritage fruit trees. Two gardens transported from Chelsea to Lindengate harmonise beautifully in the wild setting.

Ducks wander around, bird song is ever evident and there are numerous secluded places to sit awhile. The calming effect of water is much in evidence.

These words hardly do it justice so perhaps you need to go and see for yourselves!

The Mid Chilterns Primary Care Network is now five years old. It consists of the following five pactices:

- Prospect House
- John Hampden
- The Amersham Health Centre
- Rectory Meadow
- The Chequers / Hughenden Valley

These practices use the additional funding awarded to all PCN's by the NHS to provide the shared services of physiotherapists, clinical pharmacists, social prescribers, and others. More about these roles and the help that they provide in future issues of the newsletter.

The Clinical staff of the PCN meet together regularly and there is contact between the committees of the individual PPG groups as well.
